Join us this summer for a great Eventing Summer Camp! This is a wonderful opportunity for new or recently joined members to get to know other Young Riders in Area VII as well as working with top instructors in jumpers, dressage, and eventing. Camp is available to all riders from Beginning Novice level and up. In addition to instruction, we will provide all rider accommodations, meals for the riders and stabling for your horses.

Camp Provides:

Instruction- 1 lesson Saturday afternoon, 2 lessons a day on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

All meals and a large sleeping tent. Please be aware that all ages sleep together in a large circus type tent. Chaperones camp near the tent.

Stabling for your horse(s) including bedding.

Camp Fees:

\$595.00 for Area VII Young Rider members. This price gives the rider seven lessons during camp.

Fee for a second horse at camp is an additional:

\$100.00. For this additional amount you will have two lessons on each full day, one on each horse. This will give the camper a total of seven lessons but the rider decides what horse will be ridden.

\$195.00. For this amount the rider will bring two horses to camp and have three lessons each full day. The rider will receive a total of 11 lessons.

\$275.00. This will give the camper an additional two lessons each full day for a total 14 lessons on two horses. Riders will have 4 lessons a day on Sunday, Monday and Tuesday.

**Camp Rules
Area VII Young Riders
Aspen Farms, Yelm, Washington
June 20 -23, 2009**

Camp organizers wish to foster a relaxed and enjoyable atmosphere at camp. To this end, rules are simple and few and have been developed for the safety and well being of all campers. Any questions or clarification regarding camp rules, fees, arrival and departure dates, directions etc. may be addressed to Piper Cheney, pipercheney@comcast.net

- 1. These rules are for the duration of camp only. From start of camp which is NOON on Saturday, June 20th – 5:00 PM W Tuesday, June 20th. Campers should not arrive before 11 am on June 20th.**
- 2. Camp is an educational youth camp for all Young Rider members and is chaperoned by appointed parent volunteers only.**
- 3. Parents and other family members are encouraged to let their child attend camp – the purpose of camp is for YRs to get together in a non-competitive environment to relax, ride and have fun together, away from their families. All parents observing lessons at camp must remain at a respectful distance from YRs and may not involve themselves in camp activities. We are trying to make this as camp like as possible. Parents should not plan to stay at the farm overnight or join YR campers for meals or any activities unless they are a designated camp chaperone or official camp volunteer.**
- 4. No children (sisters, brothers, cousins or friends) may attend camp unless they are registered YR participants**
- 5. Any Young Rider member may attend camp if they are able to fully care for themselves and their horse without help. We will have limited supervision in the stabling area but always have someone available to help when needed.**
- 6. Helmets will be worn at all times when riding. Cross-country vests and medical arm bands will be worn for x-c.**
- 7. All Young Riders are asked to remain on site for the full duration of camp and not to leave – even if accompanied by parents – except in a family or medical emergency and with the permission of the Camp Coordinator. Anyone failing to follow these rules will not be re-admitted. Young Riders will not be able to drive while at camp.**
- 8. Any Young Rider inviting outside guests or friends to visit the camp will be asked to leave immediately.**
- 9. Young Rider Camp is an educational youth camp – any YR member smoking, drinking alcohol or using other illegal substances will be sent home directly and their membership with Young Riders' terminated.**
- 10. Any YR attending camp may not leave camp – YRs over 18 may not leave camp either.**
- 11. Any YR member attending camp who is sent home for misconduct or for leaving camp will not be refunded any camp fees or membership dues.**
- 12. Sleeping accommodation is clearly defined: all riders will sleep in the large tents provided. This rule applies even to older riders who may have living quarters in their trailer.**
